# Jolos activities contributing to Sustainable Development Goals



#### 1. Zero Hunger

We organize community helping activities for our clients where they help people in need or people suffering from war consequences.



# 7. Affordable and clean energy

- · We choose green or renewable electricity wherever possible.
- We prefer electricity from the grid if using green electricity instead of diesel generators.
- We use renewable diesel in diesel generators, in centrally organized buses, and in our company cars.



## 2. Zero Hunger

- We don't waste food. We donate food leftovers to Foodbank and Fudloop which donate to low-income families and people in need.
- To minimize food leftovers we optimize the amount of food based on our experience with people's behavior and based on previous events.
- We encourage our clients to increase plant-based food to at least 60% of the menu and decrease meat.
- We choose Fairtrade or direct trade coffee and tea to stand with farmers for fairness and equality.
- We prefer eco-labeled, seasonal, and local food wherever it is possible.



## 8. Decent work and economic growth

- · We prefer local products.
- · We guarantee just, transparent, and legal hiring of labor.
- · The working conditions of employees are healthy and safe.
- · All employees are treated equally (e.g. fair and equal pay for the same work).
- We have an inclusive internship program, where we take on a team of 4-6 trainees during the summer.
- Through TULI, we helped to create the first curriculum in Estonia specifically for event marketing specialists at the Tallinn School of Economics.
- Every year we give guest lectures at universities and host our company visits in order to prepare people better for their future jobs.



# 10. Reduced inequalities

Equal accessibility is guaranteed for all people at the events (incl. people with special needs).



#### 11. Sustainable cities and communities

- · We take care of public spaces.
- We organize planting trees, building beehives, renovating public sports facilities, and maintaining semi-natural communities for the companies that are our clients.



### 12. Responsible consumption and production

- We have set sustainability checklists for project managers and sustainability criteria for our suppliers.
- · We carry out green procurement.
- We are collecting data from our suppliers about transportation, waste, used materials, energy, water, and menu. Based on this we put together an environmental report and targets for the next event.
- We choose environmentally friendly materials and printing partners (FSC, The Nordic Swan Ecolabel)
- · We reuse and rent items instead of buying them.
- · We avoid using PVC.
- We don't waste food. We donate food leftovers to Foodbank and Fudloop which donate to low-income families and people in need.
- To minimize food leftovers we optimize the amount of food based on our experience with people's behavior and based on previous events.
- We constantly train our employees, our suppliers, and the public about how to organize sustainable events.
- · We supervise suppliers to make sure they actually prefer sustainable solutions.
- We reduce waste generation by using regular cutlery or reusable plastic cutlery instead of single-use plastic. We also don't use biodegradable packages, since there is not possible to compost these in Estonia.
- · We recycle all the waste.
- · We weigh the waste and collect the data to set future goals in waste reduction.
- We try to minimize single-use materials. For signage, we use production surpluses and produce materials without company branding so we could reuse them.
- · We don't serve water in plastic bottles.



14. Life below water

- We don't serve water in plastic bottles. We use reusable plastic cups with tap water.
- We reduce waste. We don't serve food on single-use plastic tableware. We either use regular tableware and cutlery or reusable plastic tableware and cutlery from Ringo or Panditops.
